From the Desk of President Deb Peterson

September is the beginning of NYSUT's fiscal and membership year, which affords us all with the opportunity for renewal and rejuvenation. It is also an opportunity to answer the charge of the NYSUT Standing Committee on Civil and Human Rights to advance the union's efforts to promote equity and social justice. NYSUT's agenda promotes equal access to society's opportunities, thereby empowering people to have choices and control over their own destiny. This agenda stems from the belief that injustice and oppression in other communities and nations directly impacts members of the labor movement. The premise behind this agenda is that a socially just world affords individuals and groups fair treatment and an impartial share of society's benefits. NYSUT believes that it is the fundamental responsibility of labor leaders is to stand in solidarity with the oppressed and fight to ensure that every individual enjoys basic human rights. A social justice agenda is a strategy that transforms individuals and communities.

To that end, I would like to highlight 2 NYSUT Social Justice Programs that will be introduced at both the NYSUT RC 43 Annual Conference in Orlando on September 27th and the NYSUT Regional Conference in Palm Beach Gardens on January 17, 2017.

The "Why in 5" campaign for Social Justice is a way for NYSUT members to use a short set of talking points to educate others about significant Social Justice. It is for members to use in line at the grocery store checkout, at holiday time while attending a family dinner, or in the stands at a sporting event.

With today's political landscape, it is more important than ever that our members are educated about key issues and can help us educate the members of the communities we serve so that we can continue to improve the living and working conditions both locally and nationally. The issues at stake have gone beyond the usual partisan positions; we are now facing factions that wish to significantly reduce pensions, health insurance and reduce or eliminate collective bargaining in the public sector.

For example, if your health insurance is provided to retirees in the current contract with your former employer, and the local negotiating the future contracts were to lose its power, do you think the school district would continue to pay for retirees what it does currently, out of the goodness of its heart? If you think so, I have a

bridge in Brooklyn that you might be interested in buying. PENSION DEDUCTION is the easiest way to contribute.
